Thank you so much for joining us at the 2024 celebration of California ethnic media.

It brought welcome recognition to the sector's indispensable role and serves as a national model.

Founder + Managing Editor, The Immigrant Magazine, TV/Radio Host

Pamela Asobo Anchang, Founder and Managing Editor of *The Immigrant Magazine*, is a leading advocate for immigrant rights. Since 2003, her award-winning work has focused on amplifying immigrant voices and challenging stereotypes. Her magazine, featured in top media outlets like The Los Angeles Times, NPR and VOA, is renowned for its comprehensive coverage of immigrant issues.

Pamela hosts several shows, including TIM TV Specials and Africa Speaks, on YouTube and previously led IMpact With Pamela Anchang on KPFK Pacifica Radio. Her interviews cover a broad spectrum of topics, from culture and social change to success stories of immigrant achievements, featuring celebrities and community advocates.

Beyond her media work, Pamela is actively involved in grassroots advocacy. She has collaborated with major organizations such as Fox Studios and Disney to promote authentic immigrant narratives. She also leads the "Stop The Hate in Black Immigrant Communities" campaign and ensures *The Immigrant Magazine* offers diverse media services that connect brands with multicultural audiences.

EMIL AMOK GUILLERMO

Print + Broadcast Journalist, Commentator, Humorist

Emil Amok Guillermo is an award-winning independent journalist, writer, podcaster, and comic monologist. For more than 30 years, Emil continues to write what is believed to be the longest running column on the news, race, media and culture from an Asian American perspective.

His "Emil Amok" column first appeared monthly in Filipino American publications in 1991, then weekly in San Francisco's *Asian Week* in 1995. Currently, the column is home based on the website of the Asian American Legal Defense and Education Fund (aaldef.org/blog), and seen in the *Oakland Post*, Inquirer.net, the *Hawaiian Filipino Chronicle*, and *Diverse: Issues in Higher Education*.

A collection of his work, "Amok: Essays from an Asian American Perspective," won an American Book Award in 2000. As a broadcaster, he was the first Filipino American to host a national news show when he was with NPR's "All Things Considered."

He has won multiple journalism awards from SPJ, RTNDA, AAJA, Calif. Newspaper Publishers Association, for his work in all media. His production company currently produces podcasts (the PETA PODCAST, and his secret podcast Emil Amok's Takeout on YouTube). His voice over work includes investigations for PETA that have been downloaded by millions.

Emil was the host and producer of "New California Media," the first ethnic news roundtable seen in Sacramento, San Francisco, and Los Angeles in the late '90s to 2004. He moderated several key local and regional political debates, including the first ethnic media gubernatorial debate seen statewide. He was also the host of the first ethnic media expo and awards shows held in Los Angeles and San Francisco.


